- If you have prohibited items, please declare or remove them from cabin and checked-in baggage.
- If in doubt, please contact the check-in staff.

- Failure to declare dangerous goods/prohibited items may result in your baggage being detained by security and not arriving at your destination.
- Medical/toiletries may not exceed 100ml per container with a total net quantity of 2Kg/Litre as per local regulatory authority limitations.
